RESOLVED, that the installation of two stop signs is hereby authorized, one to be placed at the southeast corner of 137 South Avenue, tax parcel 34.10-1-3, to govern southbound traffic on South Avenue; and the other to be placed on the southerly boundary of 40 Fisk Place, tax parcel 34.10-1-34, to govern traffic heading northwest to northerly on Fisk Place prior to the curve to the right which is the southwest corner of 40 Fisk Place; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Police Department of the Village of Avon and any other law enforcement agency or officer shall be and hereby is authorized to enforce the effect of those stop signs and to issue uniform traffic tickets for the violation of either of those stop signs under the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.

Re: Stop Signs on Fisk Place and South Avenue

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police and the Superintendent of the Department of Public Works have received complaints about the speed of vehicles traveling on South Avenue and Fisk Place and the layout of those streets presents hazards to the residents of that area, pedestrians and motorists; and

WHEREAS, the Chief and Superintendent have recommended that stop signs be installed at the southeast corner of 137 South Street, tax parcel 34.10-1-3, and along the south boundary of 40 Fisk Place, tax parcel 34.10-1-34, in order to diminish the speed of vehicles traveling southerly on South Avenue and northwest to northerly on Fisk Place in order to promote the health, safety and welfare of residents of the South Avenue/Fisk Place neighborhood and motorists and pedestrians using those streets;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

RESOLVED, that the installation of two stop signs is hereby authorized, one to be placed at the southeast corner of 137 South Avenue, tax parcel 34.10-1-3, to govern southbound traffic on South Avenue; and the other to be placed on the southerly boundary of 40 Fisk Place, tax parcel 34.10-1-34, to govern traffic heading northwest to northerly on Fisk Place prior to the curve to the right which is the southwest corner of 40 Fisk Place; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Police Department of the Village of Avon and any other law enforcement agency or officer shall be and hereby is authorized to enforce the effect of those stop signs and to issue uniform traffic tickets for the violation of either of those stop signs under the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.

Section 1. This local law is adopted pursuant to the authorization granted by Real Property Tax Law §458-b. All definitions, terms and conditions of such statute shall apply to this local law.

Section 2. Qualifying residential real property owned by a Cold War Veteran, or other qualified owner, shall be entitled to a partial exemption from taxation to the extent of 15% of the assessed valuation, not to exceed \$12,000.00 or the product of \$12,000.00 multiplied by the latest State equalization rate. Additionally, where the Cold War Veteran received a compensation rating from the United States veterans affairs or from the United States department of defense because of a service connected disability, qualifying residential real property shall be exempt from taxation to the extent of the product of the assessed value of such property, multiplied by fifty percent of the Cold War Veteran disability rating, not to exceed Forty Thousand Dollars of the product of Forty Thousand Dollars multiplied by the latest State equalization rate.

Section 3. This local law shall take effect immediately upon its filing in the Office of Secretary of State and be effective with the 2009 assessment roll.

ARTICLE V

Cold War Veterans Exemption

§121-14. Intent.

The purpose of this article is to provide a partial exemption from taxation imposed by the Town of Avon upon real property situated in the Town of Avon owned by persons who are Cold War Veterans as that term is defined by statute, and used as the legal residence of such persons, pursuant to the authority vested in the Town by §458-b of the Real Property Tax Law of the State of New York as amended or changed.

§121-15. Incorporation of Statute.

This local law if adopted pursuant to the authorization granted by Real Property Tax Law §458-b. All definitions, terms and conditions of such statute shall apply to this local law.

§121-15. Eligibility.

Qualifying residential real property owned by a Cold War Veteran, or other qualified owner, shall be entitled to a partial exemption from taxation to the of 15% of the assessed valuation, not to exceed \$12,000.00 or the product of \$12,000.00 multiplied by the latest State equalization rate. Additionally, where the Cold War Veteran received a compensation rating from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs or from the United State Department of Defense because of a service connected disability, qualifying residential real property shall be exempt from taxation to the extent of the product of the assessed value of such property, multiplied by fifty percent of the Cold War Veterans disability rating, not to exceed \$40,000.00 or the product of the \$40,000.00 multiplied by the latest State equalization rate.

§121-16. When Effective.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon its filing in the Office of the Secretary of State and be effective with the 2009 assessment roll.

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The Cold War and Veterans exemptions, enacted by Local Law 1 of 2007 and Local Law 2 of 2008, should be added to Chapter 110, Taxation, at §110.8 with subdivision (a) to incorporate the provisions of that local law.

Section 1. This local law is adopted pursuant to the authorization granted by Real Property Tax Law §467 for senior citizens and §459-c for persons with disabilities and limited incomes. All definitions, terms and conditions of such statutes shall apply to this local law.

Section 2. Qualifying residential real property owned by a senior citizen or a person with a disability or limited income, or other qualified owner, shall be entitled to a partial exemption from real property taxation according to the following scale:

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police and the Village Board have received complaints about the speed of vehicles entering Routes 5 and 20 from the municipal parking lot and from Genesee Street, and the existing layouts of those streets present hazards to pedestrians and motorists in that area; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police and Village Board have recommended that stop signs be installed to replace the present yield signs at the northeast corner of the exit from the municipal parking lot between 19 Park Place and the Fire Department building, and at the northeast corner of the intersection of Genesee Street and Park Place for vehicles traveling north on Genesee Street, in order to diminish the speed of vehicles traveling in that area and to promote the health, safety and welfare of residents of that neighborhood and motorists and pedestrians using those streets;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

RESOLVED, that the removal of existing yield signs and installation of two stop signs at the following points are hereby authorized, one to be placed at the northeast corner of the exit from the municipal parking lot (also the southwest corner of the Fire Department building), and one to be placed at the northeast corner of the intersection of Genesee Street and Park Place to govern vehicles traveling northerly on Genesee Street; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Police Department of the Village of Avon and any other law enforcement agency or officer shall be and hereby is authorized to enforce the effect of those stop signs and to issue uniform traffic tickets for the violation of either of those stop signs under the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.





Any person convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of Article IV or V of this chapter shall, for a conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00); for a second such conviction within eighteen (18) months thereafter, such person shall be punished by a fine of Thirty Dollars (\$30.00); upon a third or subsequent conviction within eighteen (18) months after the first conviction, such person shall be punished by a fine of Forty-Five Dollars (\$45.00).
2. Any person convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of Section 60.63 and 60.64 of this chapter shall, for a conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of Thirty-Five Dollars (\$35.00); for a second such conviction within eighteen (18) months thereafter, such person shall be punished by a fine of Forty-Five Dollars (\$45.00); upon a third or subsequent conviction, such person shall be punished by a fine of Sixty-Five Dollars (\$65.00).




