POLICE DEPARTMENT UPDATE:

Chief Tygart provided the following update to the Board:

- Since February 20, 2025, there have been 65 calls for service.
Number of VTL/ PL Arrests: 2
- During one of those EMS calls, Officer Ian Hall arrived to find a patient who was not breathing and had no pulse. Without hesitation, Officer Hall, who was assisted by the Avon Fire Department began CPR and deployed an AED, successfully restoring the patient's pulse. The patient was then transported to the hospital, where they were alert and conscious. I would like to formally recognize Officer Hall at a later date, but I just wanted to advise on a job well done by Officer Hall.
- In preparations for the St. Patrick’s Day parade and festivities on March 15th.
- Officer Tetreault’s last day at APD will be March 28th. We wish him well as he begins his journey to becoming a NYS Trooper, and are grateful for the service that he has provided during his time at Avon PD. With the departure of Officer Tetreault, APD will be interviewing potential certified Police Officer candidates.
- Officer Ferrara and Treasurer Quinlan applied for, and were awarded, a grant to purchase (5) new radar units. We are looking to get approval to order the new Stalker radars which cost \$2126 per unit (see attached quote). We are still waiting to hear on a grant regarding a new livescan fingerprint machine.

- 35 calls for the year.
- Jr. FF/RAMS program is up and running. The group attended their first call on Monday, 3/3.
- Preparing for the St. Paddy’s Day Parade on 3/15/2025.
- Request to the Board for approval of a new fire fighter, Austin Smith. Application was provided and the background check has been completed.

- Chief Piampiano presented the Board with 2 amendments to the rules and regs. These have been reviewed and voted on by the Fire Department Membership and submitted on behalf of the membership to the Board for review and approval. Mayor Hayes asked

Clerk Randall to submit the amendments to Attorney Whiting for review and will be put on the agenda for the next meeting.

TREASURER UPDATE:

Treasurer Quinlan provided the following update:

- MRB obtaining support letters for the EPG (engineering planning grant).
- MRB to submit the Triphammer project to legislators for earmark funding.
- Ken & I are preparing the PTNY application due on 3/10. Planning to apply for water filling station & pet waste system at the Erie-Attica trailhead.
- Solar project update: Met with Centrica on 2/28. Bids are coming in. Grants & incentives are still secure. Presentation to our team in April, with Board review in May. I have an email in re: another potential grant for this project.
- Emailed third quarter financials today to Board members.
- Working on budget.

CLERK UPDATE:

The following items are updates from Clerk Randall:

- Deer Committee- Week 9: 4 of 6 sites harvesting. The sites spent 8.5 hours on location during 4 sits. 2 deer were harvested. 2 shots were taken for a 100% success rate. All bolts were recovered. 6 deer were observed. The break in the weather and warmer temperatures, along with the lack of snow cover and unfavorable wind directions are having a negative impact on the number of deer visiting the corn feeders.
To date, 17 deer have been harvested: Volunteers provided 91.75 hours of participation over 37 sits. 18 shots were taken, with one non-lethal hit, for a 94% success rate. All bolts have been recovered. 22 days of harvesting have resulted in 201 deer being observed, for a daily average of 9 deer (5 per sit) 7 deer were donated (41%). 9 of the 16 participants (56%) have successfully harvested a deer. 5 participants have harvested multiple deer. (report provided by Scott Gage- Deer Committee, reports for weeks 8 and 9 provided).
- Empire Smoke Shop- 270 East Main Street- The Village received notification from the NYS Office of Cannabis Management that Empire Smoke Shop has applied for a license as an adult use-retail dispensary. The Village Board has 30 days to provide an opinion letter for or against the license, which will be used to help determine if the license will be granted. Attorney Whiting provided some background on this reminding the Board that in 2021 legislation was passed to legalize adult-use cannabis, but allowing for cities, towns, and villages to opt out of allowing retail dispensaries or on-site consumption licenses from locating within their jurisdictions providing they pass a local law to be passed by December of 2021. If the municipality did not opt-out by the deadline they would be unable to do so in the future. However, the municipality may pass local laws and regulations governing the time and place and manner of the adult-use retail dispensaries and on-site consumption licenses, providing they do not make the operation of the license unreasonably impracticable. The Village did not opt-out in 2021.

TRUSTEE UPDATE:

- Trustee Comeau discussed the meeting at the Downs with Supt. Farrell and reps from Little League. On the agenda was the fence that was donated to Little League, which is a temporary fence, and the solar powered scoreboards. These will be covered on the little Leagues insurance.
- Trustee Comeau stated that the Arbor Day Celebration will be held in the Circle Park, on April 27, 2025.
- The Farmers’ Market, an event by the Parks Commission, will be held at the Pocket Park. Target dates for the market are from June through October, Saturday mornings at 9am.
- Trustee Comeau asked if the portable restroom trailer will still be able to be used at the St. Patrick’s Day Parade, weather permitting.
- Deputy Mayor Hoffmann stated that the fire department is looking for hydrants for practice. She also stated that the parade will be advertised on the fire sign on the circle. Both Trustee Comeau and Deputy Mayor Hoffmann stated that there is information available on the website at avonholidayspectacular.com and there was still time to enter a float in the parade- no cost to be in the parade!
- Mayor Hayes reviewed his trip to Albany, recognizing Assemblywoman Andrea Bailey, our newly elected representative for District 133 (who attended our meeting). Among the discussion was CHPS and AIM funding and advocating for annual increases to meet essential needs in our municipalities. He also reviewed a new bill being presented that will be a “CHPS like” funding program for water and sewer.

MRB UPDATE:

Bill Davis and Corey Hurley attended and provided the following update:

- **WWTP Disinfection**- close to closing out the project, waiting on the delivery of the gate.
- Joint Water Tank Project- started on design. Waiting for a break in the weather for surveying. Also working on an amendment to the contract to roll in old invoices.
- **Triphammer Project**- Reviewed the draft proposal for professional services provided to the Village Board. This proposal is to assist in preparing a grant application, environmental review and submission to the Intended Use Plan for the Triphammer watermain improvement project. The engineering report will need to be updated, and we want to target the WIIA Grant in May. Have drafted a letter to the AKZO Committee requesting funding as well.

WHEREAS, The Village of Avon supports the submission of a 2025 Wastewater Infrastructure Engineering Planning Grant (EPG) application on behalf of the Village, to conduct a study of Waste Water Treatment Plant Filtration Improvements; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC), provides a competitive statewide reimbursement grant program to assist in the initial planning of eligible Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) water quality projects; and

WHEREAS, The Village of Avon meets the municipal median household income thresholds for EPG eligibility; and

WHEREAS, if funding is received it will allow the Village of Avon to prepare a preliminary engineering report to investigate improvements to its Wastewater Treatment Plant filtration and recommend solutions, enabling the Village to seek further financing for construction through the CWSRF program to advance the required water quality improvements;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Village Board, on behalf of the Village, identifies the Village Mayor as the authorized representative for the project, able to execute necessary documents relative to and as required for this application; and

Brief Description of Proposed Action (include purpose or need): The Village of Avon owns and maintains the existing Triphammer watermain that supplies water to residents in the Town of Avon and the Town of Geneseo. This watermain is approximately 16,000 linear feet of 12-inch watermain that was installed approximately 100 years ago to serve as the transmission line for the Village of Avon. The existing Triphammer line runs from Pole Bridge Road to the Village's two-million-gallon water storage tank on Reservoir Road in the Town of Avon. The existing Triphammer was intended to be abandoned after a new transmission line was installed for the Village of Avon in the 1980s but has remained active to continue to serve the residents connected to it in the Town of Avon and the Town of Geneseo. The proposed action is to install new watermain in the Town of Avon and the Town of Geneseo that will connect to existing dead end water mains and serve the same residents currently served off the existing Triphammer line, so the old main can finally be properly abandoned. The Town of Geneseo Water District No. 6 will also be created.






