Whereas, it is with honor the Town Clerk can recognize and pay tribute to those within the Town of Avon who have made strong contributions to their communities and serve as role models for their peers; and

Whereas, the Honorable Justice James C. Orman according to the Avon Central School official records was elected/appointed and provided valuable leadership serving as an Avon Central School Board Members September 25, 1967 through July 11, 1972; and

Whereas, the Honorable Justice James C. Orman according to the Village of Avon's official records was elected/appointed to serve as Acting Police Justice from 1976 through 1993 and as Village Justice from 1993 through 2006; and

Whereas, The Honorable James C. Orman according to Town records served the Town of Avon in many positions; and

Whereas, at a meeting of the Town Board held on January 11, 1973, James C. Orman was appointed by Avon Town Board Supervisor Albert Burke, Councilmen Richard Coyne and Charles Moran, Councilmen/Justices James Steele, and William Farr, to serve as The Environmental Council for a two-year term along with Frank Fusco.

Whereas, at a Special Meeting of the Town Board held on November 6, 1975 the Avon Board Members Supervisor Albert C. Burke; Councilman Charles Moran, and Councilman/Justice William Farr authorized James C. Orman to attend Justice School in Buffalo at the expense of the Town of Avon; and

Whereas, at the Organization Meeting held on January 2, 1976, the Honorable Justice James Orman began his term to serve the dual position of Justice/Town Board Member until January 3, 1980 when the positions were separated, and the Honorable Justice James C. Orman served as one of the Town Justices; and

Whereas, the Honorable Justice James C. Orman completed his term that ended on December 31, 2003; and

Whereas, The Honorable Justice James C. Orman was contacted to return on July 28, 2005, by the Town Board members including Supervisor David LeFeber, Deputy Supervisor Deborah Coyne and Councilmen Donald Cook, Jr., Gary Wheat and Kelly Cole to once again serve as Town Justice to complete a term of the Honorable Justice Ellen Coyne who resigned during her term; and
